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AUL Roos' third – and final – season as Melbourne coach has now arrived. Roos' reign could be likened to a trilogy.

which has set the scene for a more exciting story to come.

Already, Roos has overseen Melbourne from a two-win team – when he took over in September 2013 – to seven wins last year. It's a considerable effort, given Melbourne endured its fifth worst season in VFL/AFL history in 2013.

Now, there is light at the end of the tunnel – even if it remains unclear how long the journey will take.

Still, the 2005 premiership coach, said there was genuine excitement about the club in 2016, given "the changes that have been made over the past two years and the improvement we've started to see".

Roos said he was optimistic about regaining several players this year, after injury marred their 2015.

"[Dean] Kent, Christian Salem and Sam Frost were out for a long period of time, so they're probably three names that jump out at you. We saw a bit of them playing and when you put those guys back into the team, we certainly look better," he said.

"Again, [Aaron] vandenBerg and Dom Tyson missed a lot of football, so they're guys we're starting to develop into good players and we didn't have them for the whole season last year. Seeing them back training again [is exciting].

"I'm really excited about Dom's year; he had a lot of injuries last year and battled through which is a good characteristic. They're the names that probably jump out at you."

And Roos wasn't adding any pressure on the likes of Christian Petracca, who was sidelined last year due to a knee injury.

"Everyone wants to know about the young guys, but the reality is we haven't actually seen the young guys play. Everyone talks about Christian Petracca but I haven't seen him play [in the AFL], whereas I've seen Dean Kent play, Salem play, vandenBerg and Tyson play. We know what we miss when they weren't playing," he said.

"They're the names that immediately jump off the page because of the amount of games they missed last year."

There is no doubt 2016 is a season of transition.

Roos said senior assistant coach Simon Goodwin, who will take over as coach at the end of the season, had been given "autonomy in terms of running the program".

"When you're an assistant coach and you become a senior coach, all of a sudden you've got to run your own program and plan your training drills," he said.

"There's a lot more help now, so he's been fantastic in really running the programs this pre-season and driving

the other coaches and driving the development and driving the education – it's been terrific."

Passing the baton isn't something new for Roos. He did it at the end of the 2010 season, when he handed over the Sydney Swans senior coaching position to John Longmire.

"This is a younger team than we had when I was at Sydney, so we've really beefed up the development staff [and] there are probably more people to manage," he said.

"Equally, there are more bodies to do more things so as a guy who's been around footy for a long time – there are some changes [I've seen].

"In some ways, I see some similarities. Simon is really well organised like John was and they're similar. But probably more staff and more things to do than there were before [are the main differences]."

Roos said entering his final season as Melbourne's senior coach had a "similar" feel to when he coached his last year with Sydney.

"I didn't think I'd coach again, so it's the second time I've been through it. I'm probably more prepared for it now and more excited about [it]," he said.

As for what's next? Roos said greater family time was on the agenda.

"[My wife] Tami is a priority with the family and getting overseas a little bit more. I'll still be involved in the footy season and will hopefully do some work with Fox and continue the relationship, which I've had with them which will be good," he said.

"The priority is on the family and the sacrifice that Tami has made and now to repay [that].

"She's been here for 24 years [after moving from the United States], so that's probably more what we're thinking about. We're just really looking forward to getting the best result we can for Melbourne."

Still, Roos is hellbent to make the most of every opportunity in his last season.

"The expectation is more [on] an appreciation of how tough the competition is and we still have got a lot of work to do," he said.

"Our expectations are that we turn this footy club into a really, really good footy club. We would love to have a date on when that's going to happen but it's not as simple as that. I think we've got great personnel, we've improved our playing list, we've got a lot of talent on the list and now we've got to develop them and teach them how to win.

"So they're my expectations, that we continue to evolve as a footy club and continue to improve and the destination we want to get to is hopefully not too far away."

ROOS **SET FOR** 3RD AND FINAL INSTAL MENT

FRONT PAUL ROOS BACK SIMON GOODWIN

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HRISTIAN SALEM was ready and raring to go for a huge 2015.

With his first full pre-season under his belt, the second-year player started to make his mark, locking down a space on Melbourne's half-back line for the first six games of the year.

But in his seventh consecutive game, Salem felt his hamstring give way and was subbed out partway through the clash with Hawthorn.

From there, it was a long road back to senior football. "It was pretty frustrating," Salem said.

<u>"I ended up p</u>laying the first seven games of the year

then did my hammy. "Then four weeks into rehab, I was meant to come back the next week. I did my other one, which meant I missed about 12 weeks of footy, which wasn't ideal."

Not to be deterred by the setbacks, Salem instead focused his energy on finishing the season strongly, building fitness through the VFL, before returning for the final three rounds of Melbourne's season.

In the round 23 match against GWS Giants, he showed his wares, registering 24 possessions and seven tackles





to be among Melbourne's best performers and finish his season on a high.

"I had a strong focus on getting back as quickly as I could and I ended up playing the last three games," Salem said.

"I was pretty happy with how I finished off and I'll try and use that to launch into this season."

With the learning experience of 2015 behind him, Salem has completed close to a full pre-season heading into his third year of senior football.

"It's been a much better pre-season because it's been more footy-focused," he said.

"We've done a lot more work on our offence and it's been all about ball movement and how we want to play."

With his ability to read and set up the play, Salem has the potential to play an important role in the transition between defence and attack.

While he shone at half-back last year, the 20-year-old's silky foot skills mean a shift into the midfield looks

increasingly likely.

"We haven't really spoken a whole lot about a fixed position," Salem said.

"I've been doing about 50 per cent of my pre-season with the midfielders and 50 per cent down back, which is good, just to change a few roles and get used to different positions when I'm in them.

"But whatever's best for the team is what I'll play."

Salem is one of a number of young Demons looking to make an impact off the back of injuries.

In a similar vein, small forward Dean Kent missed the majority of 2015 with a severe hamstring injury, but has been one of the standouts this pre-season.

"Another one that we haven't seen much of but is really important to us is Kenty," Salem said.

"He missed quite a bit of last year with his hammy, but it's going to be awesome having him back buzzing around in the forward line."

Another player Salem expects to improve is fellow 2014 draftee and former Brighton Grammar schoolmate Jayden Hunt.

Having had an interrupted first two seasons through back



injuries, Hunt broke through for six VFL games in 2015 and impressed with his speed and smarts around goals.

"Jayden Hunt's gone to another level," Salem said.

"He was a bit skinny last year – he's put on some size, and his learning ability in terms of playing roles and using the footy, has got a lot better.

"So he's one that's just improved dramatically."

Salem is among a group of talented youngsters looking to play their role in Melbourne's push up the ladder.

With the likes of Angus Brayshaw, Jesse Hogan, Alex Neal-Bullen and Billy Stretch gaining significant experience in their first full seasons, Salem said it was good to see the group developing together.

"It's very exciting – I think you'll see more young guys come through this year like Clayton Oliver," Salem said.

"Hopefully Sam Weideman's up and going [at some point] because what he's done on the track so far has been pretty impressive – even though he's been in

and out of the rehab group.

"Some of the guys are building on last year – we all know about Gussy (Brayshaw) and how impressive he was, so hopefully he can take it to another level, along with Bill Stretch and Alex Neal-Bullen."

With three players under 23 – Jack Viney, Tom McDonald and Hogan – all finishing in the top four of Melbourne's 2015 best and fairest, the scene has been set for young players to make their mark.

With 22 AFL games now under his belt, Salem is among those looking to make an impression in 2016.

"It's a really exciting time at the club and I think it's one for us younger players," he said.

"The older guys have been there for a while and now us second, third and fourth year players really drive [the excitement]."

Whatever excitement the 2016 season brings, expect Christian Salem's left boot to be a key part of the ride.

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HEN considering some of Melbourne's brightest talent, the likes of Jesse Hogan, Tom McDonald, Jack Viney, Christian Salem, Angus Brayshaw and Christian Petracca often come to the forefront of people's minds.

That's looking at the players who enter the 2016 season 23 years or younger.

But there is also one player who mustn't be forgotten in that group: Dom Tyson.

It's not two years since the classy midfielder finished second in Melbourne's best and fairest, yet after a frustrating 2015, marred by several injuries, Tyson is on track to return to the type of form that saw him come runner-up to Nathan Jones in the Keith 'Bluey' Truscott Memorial Trophy in 2014.

"I've improved this pre-season and I've got a lot more confidence back in my body and I'm just excited to get amongst it, playing in 2016. Hopefully I can be part of a side that's ready to play better footy," he said.

"Some things I couldn't control and other things were good learning experiences for me last year. Hopefully in three to four years' time I can look back and say that the 2015 season was a year that shaped me as a player, knowing how far I can play with injury, respecting the game and knowing my body.

"I was 21 turning 22 last year and I felt like I learned a lot about my craft and becoming a consistent footballer. Hopefully I can take all of those experiences into 2016 and perform close to 2014 again, so that's what I'll be hoping to do."

Tyson enters this season with 50 AFL matches to his name, including 13 with Greater Western Sydney from 2012-13. He notched up his half-century – and 37th Melbourne game – against North Melbourne at the MCG





in round 19 last year, before injury finished his year. In total, he missed six matches last season (rounds eight and nine with a knee injury and the last four with a hamstring), but it was the injury early in the year that impacted his 2015.

"The knee was probably the main one, when I tweaked the medial in round four [against Richmond] and played on. In hindsight, I probably should've just taken the medicine and missed a few weeks to make sure it was right for the rest of the year," he said.

"I didn't quite get it right and consequently the hamstring compensated and gave away by about round 17 or 18 and I missed the last month of footy, which was frustrating.

"I went away and had a good off-season and travelled and freshened up. Since then I haven't missed too much of a beat with training. Hopefully, we can put on a good display in 2016 and beyond."

Tyson said Melbourne's midfield brigade was making



genuine progress and he was determined to help take the group to the next level.

"In terms of age, experience, size and speed, we've got guite a few boys now that we can throw through the middle and that's what most good sides have. Our midfield grunt and spread is also building," he said.

"Blokes like [Jack] Viney, [Aaron] vandenBerg and [Angus] Bravshaw will be important, as will Bernie [Vince] and Nathan [Jones], who did a lot of work in 2015."

In his third season at Melbourne, Tyson said he now felt part of the red and blue tribe and was determined to help take the club forward.

"I want to be around for a long time and play footy for Melbourne." he said.

"It's really exciting and without looking too far ahead, it's nice to know that you'll be playing footy with blokes who are going to be around for a while.

"It's really exciting for me and other blokes around my age and younger."

Tyson said the transition from Paul Roos to Simon Goodwin as senior coach was really starting to take shape.

"It's great for the overall stability of the club to have a senior coach who has come in with the same methods, even if a few things have been tweaked," he said.

"Overall, there is a familiarity with

players and staff already there, so it should be relatively smooth.

"Already Goodwin has taken on a pretty big role and it'll increase – he's already taking over the training side of things, which has been good. Overall, it's exciting to have stability for the next four seasons with the senior coach."

As for 2016, Tyson was adamant about how Melbourne will fare.

"I certainly expect and think we'll improve on last year. Every side wants to improve and we're like every other in that aspect," he said.

"By the way we've trained this pre-season there is a lot of confidence in the group that we can have a pretty good 2016 and

improve on 2015."

"If we can be competitive in every game this year and be in a lot of games at three quarter-time, hopefully we'll win more than we lose. That's the aim for the club. It's just exciting for the club and I really can't wait for the start of the season."

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Anna Harrington speaks to women's team captain Daisy Pearce about her new role at Melbourne.

Anna Harrington: Daisy, tell us about the role you've taken up at the club.

Daisy Pearce: It's like an internship. Peter Jackson approached me about the idea of working at the club or within the industry. He tried to get a gauge about where I see myself fitting in and the list got way too long to start off in any one place. So the idea is to get a really good experience and a good taste of the whole football club, from the administration all the way down to the footy department. So I'll get the opportunity to do that over the next couple of years and work out what really gets me ticking and focus on that.

AH: Are there any areas you're particularly interested in focusing on down the track?

DP: Naturally my heart lies over at AAMI Park in the footy department but I'm looking forward to all the different experiences. I'm in the commercial operations at the moment and working a bit in sponsorship too. I'll probably surprise myself – things I didn't even know were a part of working in a footy club, or different aspects that you don't see from the outside – may just bob up and really interest me.

I'm really grateful for the opportunity I've got to effectively "try before I buy" in all areas and I really hope that over the first few years I'll be able to make a contribution to the club, not just get something out of it myself.

AH: What do you think are the strengths that have made you suited to working in this environment?

DP: I've always thrived in a team environment because I like working with people. When you work in a big group you see everyone else's strengths and you can role model different parts of the way you go about things based on their strengths. Coming from the background I have in midwifery, it's a pretty high pressure environment at times, so I don't think the pressure of working within a footy club will faze me too much. I enjoy that pressure so hopefully I can shine in those moments.

AH: Peter Jackson has said you and Michelle Cowan were identified as talent through our involvement with women's footy. How has that journey led you to a position at Melbourne?

DP: That's the beauty of sport – it gives you the opportunity to network and have conversations and get opportunities you may not have had previously. Playing footy and talking footy is what we do every weekend, but through being involved at Melbourne in the exhibition games, it gives you the opportunity to do it in this environment. Then people working within the industry take a bit of notice and realise that you've got a lot to offer the game – and how passionate you are about the game as well. So I think it's probably opened a few doors in that sense.

AH: Between your position as captain of the women's team and your role at the club, it must be a pretty exciting time for you personally?

DP: Over the last few years, I've loved every minute of it. I've been working full-time as a midwife while being an ambassador for the Melbourne Football Club and the AFL, and

> playing as well. So it means I've been spread pretty thin. Hopefully being here means that my workplace, my training and my playing is all pretty centralised. I'll have access to some great facilities and hopefully it all works in together and contributes – not just to my career, but also my ability to play over the next couple of years as well.
