This year signalled the conclusion of our first three year Strategic Plan. In 2003 we established very clear objectives that needed to be achieved across all levels of the club in order to improve our overall performance, critical to ensuring that our club could be a stable and strong club capable of competing in a very competitive environment.

FOCUS ON achieving those objectives was essential in order to lay the necessary foundations from which the club could make significant progress in the immediate years ahead. Our resolve was steadfast and our focus did not falter nor were we side-tracked from the achievement of those objectives.

In February this year we were able to make our final licence fee payment to the AFL to signal the removal of the entire club's debt, which stood at over \$8 million in 2002. Our revenues have grown to be the highest they have ever been at any other time. Our membership set another record this year with over 34,000 members only further proving, if ever that was needed, how loyal and passionate our supporters are. We have posted our third consecutive operating profit to bring our total profits over the last three years to over \$2.5 million, a remarkable result.

Across all key measures we are now positioned as one of the top five clubs in the competition. This is an achievement of which everyone associated with the club should be proud. Those foundations for a stable and strong football club have now been firmly laid.

Next year we are entering arguably our most important phase as a club. Our new three year plan is about delivering the next level of growth and development with our primary focus on the delivery of sustained on-field success. However, with the club's structures and processes now well established and under the guidance of quality management and staff, we will not lose focus off the field and will continue to improve our off field performance and maintain our path of growth.

Our focus is clearly on our achievements as a football team. We have systematically and deliberately concentrated on shaping our playing list over the last few years and retaining our players who we firmly believe can deliver the success that we all seek. As we all know, the success we crave does not come easily and it certainly does not come simply because we want it to. It comes through planning and commitment.

We have the players, coaches and staff who have the level of commitment needed to deliver success. No one is more disappointed with the season than the players and coaches. The level of determination of the player group to succeed next year is as strong as I have ever seen.

Despite the disappointment of the season to miss the September action, we did have some achievements and some memorable moments. We continued to improve our record on the road though our record at Subiaco Oval was again a concern. We recorded our highest ever score, won for the first time at Skilled Stadium, equalled our record of five consecutive wins, and then there was round 21. The St Kilda game will stick long in our memories as one of the great wins by our club. The nerves of everyone at the ground and at home were fully tested in the last five minutes as we fought to record a stirring after-the-siren win.

It was a tough year as injuries took their toll in the middle part of the season. The senior squad was impacted significantly as our injury fortunes changed dramatically

from previous years. Though we rued the loss of key players, some of our exciting young talent seized the moment to make their AFL debuts, gaining valuable game time and AFL experience. They showed us that they and the club are well positioned for the future.

The second half run of the season was outstanding. All but written off at the mid-season break, the performance of the team to dig deep and restore a realistic finals opportunity was a credit to the group, and though it was taken away in round 22 it showed us all what the team is capable of and gives us all encouragement for season 2006.

As we look forward to next year, we welcome our new Major Sponsor LG Electronics to the club. It is a great honour to have the support of one of Australia's and the world's leading companies for the next three years as we enter into an exciting period for the club. We look forward to a long and mutually rewarding partnership.

Your club has come a long way over the last four years but we are all fully aware of the necessity to be armed and ready for the challenge that lay ahead.

We believe the foundation is in place and is strong, and that all are committed to building on that as we approach the seasons ahead. All at the club are looking forward to the next step with great anticipation. We are approaching season 2006 with confidence and enthusiasm and are committed to success for the Fremantle Football Club as we build on those carefully laid foundations.

Thank you to one and all for your loyal support in 2005 and I ask for your continued passionate support next season.

For the players and everyone at the club, season 2005 was a very disappointing year. It was disappointing for a number of reasons and not just that we finished outside the final eight. It was a year that had massive ups and downs through the season. We had some great wins matched with some poor performances. It was indeed a frustrating year for all concerned none more so than for the players.

EACH PLAYER worked extremely hard and focused all their energies on experiencing finals action. That is what every player works towards. We have added to and developed the player group for just that reason. For most of the group that experienced our first finals in 2003, we are desperate to experience that again. When we don't achieve that goal, we suffer the disappointment deeply.

Our year was also frustrating as we felt the impacts of injuries at a level that we had not experienced over the last three years. We lost senior players for long periods of time, especially in the first half of the season. All the preparation that went

into our game plan over the pre-season was progressively dismantled and we were forced to make major adjustments, especially to our defence that was hit the hardest by injury. But this is not an excuse as injuries are a part of football.

As injuries took their toll, it provided opportunities for our younger players to taste AFL football for the first time and they performed exceptionally well when that opportunity arose. David Mundy, Michael Johnson, Brett Peake and Ryan Crowley all gained valuable game experience and that will hold them and the club in good stead for the future.

I was proud of the character shown by the player group to respond as they did in the second half of the season after a very difficult first half of the year gave us only five wins from fourteen games. To work ourselves back into a position to make the finals was great effort and shows what this group is capable of in the future. But the competition is about consistency of performance and that was again missing from us this year.

Consistency is our focus for next year. We continued to improve our performance on the road this year, something that we have worked really hard at over the last couple of years. At home we let our members and supporters down at times and we will be doing everything that we can to restore Subiaco Oval to once again be a ground to be feared by opposition clubs.

A special acknowledgement needs to be made to Shane Parker who became the first player to play 200 games for Fremantle. Shane has been with the club since day one

and it is a fantastic effort to reach such a milestone. He is an exceptional individual and a real professional who goes about his job with a minimum of fuss, giving 100 per cent for the club each week.

On behalf of the players I would like to thank all our members and supporters. The club enjoys fantastic, loyal support and Fremantle members have stuck with the players and the club throughout what has been a difficult year. Our supporters are passionate about the club and no doubt were as disappointed as we were with the year. We had a record membership level in 2005 and we all look forward to that continued support in 2006.

Rest assured that the results in 2005 hurt. The players will be working hard through the pre-season to be ready to tackle 2006 head-on. It is an important year for us as a club and a player group. We have to deliver on our potential and we will be focused on staking our position in the eight. What position you can never predict but anything outside the eight will not be acceptable to us.

We have a player group with the experience necessary to succeed, not only experience in the AFL but more importantly the experience of being together as a group for a period of time.

The player group is ready.

VICE CAPTAIN Matthew Pavlich capped off an outstanding year winning the 2005 Doig Medal. After moving permanently to the forward line in 2005, Matthew became the club's leading goal scorer in season 2005 with 61, to place him second behind the club's season record holder Tony Modra (71). Matthew's career tally has reached 169 goals, just nine goals behind Clive Waterhouse as the club's all-time leading goal scorer.

Forty of Matthew's 61 goals came in the last nine games of the season at an average 4.4 goals per game and he was instrumental in Fremantle's resurgence in the second half of the year. Matthew had bags of nine (round 16 v Carlton), eight (round 14 v Adelaide), and six (round 7 v Collingwood) with a season accuracy of 71 per cent, and an amazing accuracy of 83 per cent in the second half of the season. Matthew's season tally of 61 goals placed him seventh in the competition in 2005.

Matthew took 178 marks to finish third in the AFL with an average 8.1 marks per game and had 372 disposals at an average 17 possessions per game. He was the club's leading vote-getter at the 2005 Brownlow Medal count with 14 votes, finishing in a tie for seventh overall.

To cap an outstanding year, Matthew earned his third All Australian selection in 2005, selected as centre half forward and follows his All Australian honours in 2002 and 2003.

This season Matthew played all 22 games to take his tally to 128 games, the last 97 consecutively to be the club record holder

for consecutive games. He has played an amazing 128 from a possible 133 games since joining the AFL and has not missed a game since round 15 of 2001.

Matthew has placed in the top three in the Doig Medal for the last four years and his 2005 Doig Medal joins his win in 2002, his runner-up silver medal in 2003 and third place medal in 2004. Matthew now joins Captain Peter Bell as the only multiple winner of the prestigious Doig Medal.

Peter Bell

CAPTAIN Peter Bell capped off another outstanding year to finish in the top three of the Doig Medal for the fifth consecutive year since returning to the club in 2001. The triple Doig Medallist (2001, 2003, and 2004) was also runner-up in 2002 behind Matthew Pavlich. The club's longest serving captain (84 games) again led the team magnificently through the year playing 18 games to take his AFL games tally to 228. In round 17, Peter played his 100th game for the club to become only the 22nd player in the history of the game to play 100 games for two clubs having also played 123 games for the Kangaroos from 1996 to 2000 that included two premierships and the 2000 Kangaroos Best and Fairest. Peter was selected in the WA State of Origin Team for the third consecutive year in a season where he had 422 possessions at an average of 23.4 per game and laid 69 tackles at an average 3.8 per game. Peter is the club's all time leading Brownlow vote getter with 62 votes.



Shane Parker

IN A MEMORABLE year, Shane became the first Fremantle player to play 200 games for the club when he took the field against Carlton in round 16 at the MCG to hold the club's all-time games record of 206 games. In a year where injury impacted the defence significantly, Shane played all 22 games and was again called upon to lead the defence taking on opponents outside his weight division. The cool hand in the defensive structure, Shane was often asked to play on taller, quicker or stronger opponents. Once again he never failed to give 100 per cent and his consistent performance in 2005 was rewarded by winning the silver Doig Medal. Shane was runner-up in the 1997 Doig Medal and third in 2002.



Third Place – Heath Black

RETURNING TO Fremantle in 2005 after three seasons with St Kilda, Heath proved to be the recruit of the year for Fremantle playing all 22 games and was the club's leading possession-winner with 480 disposals at an average of 21.8 possessions per game, with his 329 kicks placing him tenth overall in the AFL. He also took 112 marks and kicked 13 goals in a dominant return to Fremantle. Heath has now played a total of 91 games for the club and a total of 145 AFL games overall. His third placing in the Doig Medal was a fitting reward for a strong and consistent year and joins his runner-up medal in 2001, his last year with the club before moving to St Kilda. Heath received further recognition for an outstanding year with selection in the Australian side for the 2005 International Rules Series.

WHILE PAUL'S season was affected by nagging injury, he went on to play all 22 games amassing 452 disposals (second only to Heath Black) including a club-high 228 handballs, taking 96 marks (including Mark of The Week in round 15), and laying 72 tackles. His fourth place this year follows a third place in 2003 and runners-up medals in 2004 and 2000. Paul was the club's Beacon Award winner in 2000, winning the AFL's Rising Star Award in the same year. Paul polled 12 Brownlow votes in 2005 to finish second behind Matthew Pavlich for Fremantle. Paul has played 130 games for the club, the last 89 consecutively having not missed a game since round 1 2002.

Scott Thornton

THE CLUB'S fifth round selection at the 2000 National Draft (selection 66 overall) Scott's career has been hampered by persistent injury managing only 15 games prior to the 2005 season after making his AFL debut in 2002. A strong pre-season resulted in Scott playing all 22 games in 2005 providing strong marking and run from defence in a consistent season. Scott finished in the top 10 at Fremantle for disposals (294 possessions, sixth place), handballs (138, sixth) and marks (94, eighth). The former Sandringham Dragon has shown in 2005 that he will be an important part of the club's future.

Fifth Place – Jeff Farmer

THE WIZARD again continued to perform consistently in the Fremantle forward line kicking 35 goals to finish second behind Matthew Pavlich, including a dominant seven goal haul in round 6 against his old club Melbourne. Jeff has now played 199 AFL games and kicked 386 goals with 127 goals in 81 games for Fremantle. He again proved in 2005 to be one of the competition's premier small forwards and was the club's leading goal scorer in eight games in 2005. His outstanding season was rewarded with his selection in the 2005 WA State of Origin Team. In 2006 Jeff will become only the eighth indigenous player to play 200 AFL games.

2005 Beacon Award Winner – David Mundy

THE ANNUAL Beacon Award is presented to the club's best new talent. To be eligible, a player must be under the age of 21 years on or before 31 December of the previous year and have played less than 10 games at the start of the season.

This year's Beacon Award winner was David Mundy who, after being selected by the club in the 2003 National Draft, made his debut for the club in round 6 against Melbourne at the MCG and went on to play the remaining 17 games of the season. He earned an AFL Rising Star nomination in round 14 against Adelaide and ultimately finished third in the award for the year. The young defender showed throughout the year that he will be an exciting part of the future of the club.

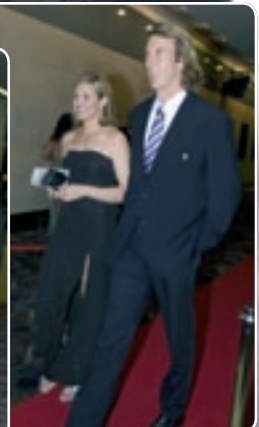
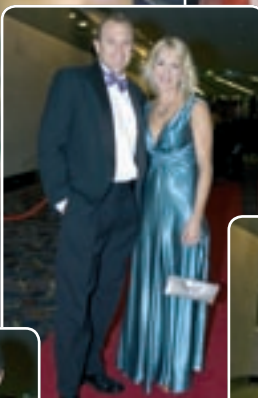
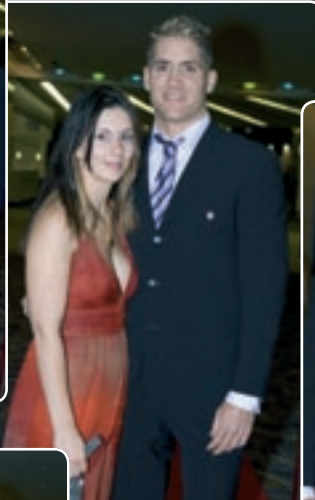
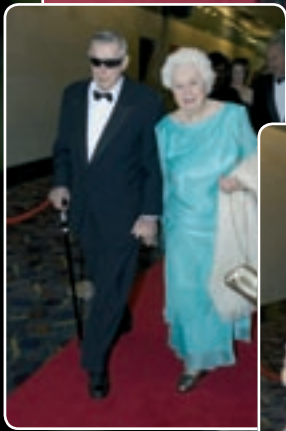
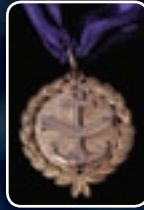
Best Clubman – Troy Cook

THE POPULAR hard man was at his damaging best in 2005, leading the tackle averages for the club at 4.2 per game over 20 games for the year and averaging 16.4 possessions per game. The 2000 Doig Medallist played his 150th AFL in round 3, and took his career tally to 168 games, of which 126 have been with Fremantle. Since joining Fremantle in 2000, Troy has been the club's leading tackler for five of the six years, and has polled 31 Brownlow votes to be fifth highest vote getter for Fremantle.

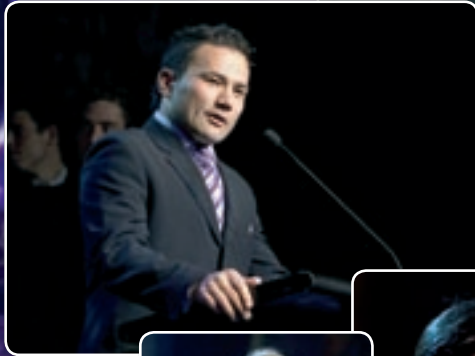

The club began its second decade in the strongest position since entering the competition and is now placed among the strongest and most viable clubs in the AFL.

THIS IS something that everyone associated with the club, Directors, staff, players, members and supporters should be proud of particularly given that it was only a few short years ago that the club was heavily in debt and recording heavy trading losses.

The closing of the 2005 season also saw the completion of the club's first detailed Strategic Plan. Developed in 2002 and implemented for the period from 2003 to 2005, this Strategic Plan established clear objectives and directions across all areas of the club's operations, vital as we set about rebuilding the club from the parlous state it was in at the end of 2002.

Stability is key ingredient in any business operation and especially in a football club at the elite level. It is that ingredient that we have built over the last three years and which will hold us in good stead in the future.

Importantly, the plan has delivered pleasing results for the club that more than anything, underlines the outstanding potential that Fremantle has to be one of the great clubs of this competition. It also gives context to the next phase of our development.

To lead the club into this stage, a new Strategic Plan for the period 2006 to 2008 has been developed. It is titled "The Premiership Quarter", this plan is clearly aimed at taking the club to the next level within the competition, both on and off the field, while maintaining a key focus on ensuring that the advances made over the last three years are not compromised.

Key Achievements of the Strategic Plan 2003 to 2005

- A 43.5 per cent increase in membership with 10,349 new members
- Average home game attendances have increased 33.6 per cent to average over 35,000 per game
- Total club revenues have increased 29 per cent to over \$23 million (\$10.92m in 2001)
- The club is now debt free and has generated almost \$3 million in operating profits
- The club has enjoyed its most successful period in the AFL to date with a 54.6 per cent winning ratio, including a 58.8 per cent winning ratio in Melbourne
- Increased levels of corporate Support with increased sales of sponsorship properties and increased sales in corporate facilities (Corporate Suites, VIP Boxes and game day dining)
- \$1 million in merchandise sales for the first time

It is also brings to a conclusion the Governor's three year reign as the club's inaugural Patron. During that time the Governor has given his time generously to assist the club, in many ways. While his formal role with the club may have drawn to a close, as a loyal and passionate member we know that he will be with us wholeheartedly in the future.



At this year's Doig Medal Dinner, President Rick Hart presented the club's first Life Member Medals to inaugural Chairman Ross Kelly, who did so much for our club in its formative years, and to inaugural players Shaun McManus and Shane Parker who qualified for their Life Membership having achieved their 150 game milestones in 2004. Three very deserving individuals who have given so much to our football club and have played a crucial part in helping make this club what it is today.

IN 2003 the Constitution of the Fremantle Football Club was amended to allow for the election of two (2) member elected representatives on the Board of Directors of the club. Mr David Garic and Mr Les Everett were elected in 2003 for two (2) year and one (1) year terms respectively. Mr Les Everett re-nominated and was re-elected to the Board in the 2004 elections for a two year period from 1 December 2004 to 30 November 2006.

Mr David Garic, elected to the Board in the 2003 elections, did not re-nominate at the expiry of his term on 30 November 2005. The club would like to thank David for his commitment during his two years as a member of the Board of Directors. David brought an important 'grass roots' understanding to the Board and was very proud of the important role he played in

having members elected representatives on the club's Board.

Mr Greg Wall, a member of the Board of Directors since 2002, has tendered his resignation from the Board due to his increasing business commitments. Greg's role during this time cannot be underestimated. He brought insight and business acumen to the board and has played a key role in the club's financial turnaround over the last three years.

The club welcomes Mr Ben Allan who was elected by the members in the 2005 elections to the Board of Directors for a two (2) year term until 30 November 2007.

Ben was the club's inaugural captain in 1995 and played 47 games for the club. Originally from Claremont winning a Simpson medal in the 1989 grand final

against South Fremantle, Ben was selected by Hawthorn in the 1989 National Draft and went on to play 98 games winning the 1991 Hawthorn Best and Fairest and a member of Hawthorn's 1991 Premiership side. He was also an All Australian representative in 1993 and 1994, Ben returned to lead the inaugural Fremantle side in 1995. Ben took over as Senior Coach in the 2001 season following the departure of Damian Drum mid-season. Ben has established a successful corporate career in the wine industry.

There were twelve (12) Board of Directors meetings through the course of the year chaired by President Mr Rick Hart, twelve (12) Audit and Governance Sub-Committee meetings chaired by Mr Mel Ashton, eleven (11) List Management Sub-Committee meetings chaired by Mr David Rawlinson and two (2) Remuneration Sub-Committee meetings chaired by Mr Len Hitchen.

All Directors fulfil their roles in a voluntary capacity.

FINANCE

THE CLUB'S financial objective of the 2003-2005 Strategic Plan was "to turn Fremantle into a profitable, financially stable football club by building net revenues, judiciously managing costs and reducing debt".

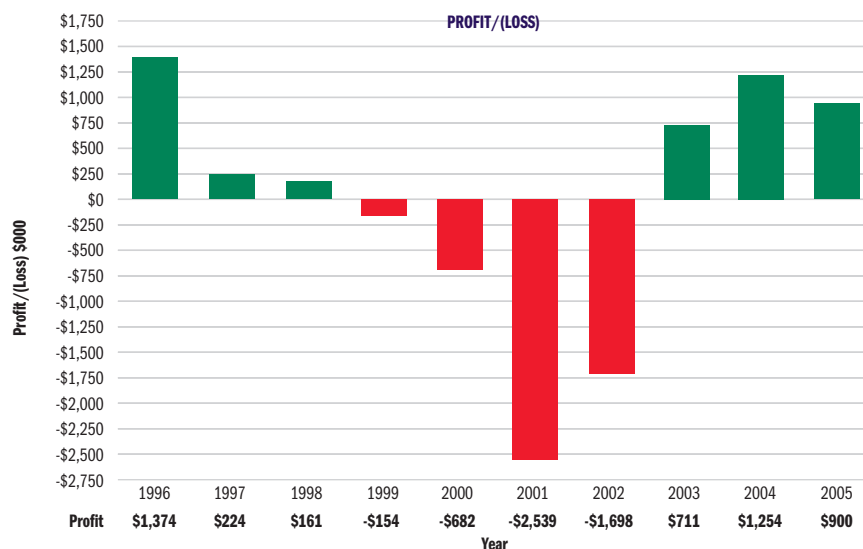
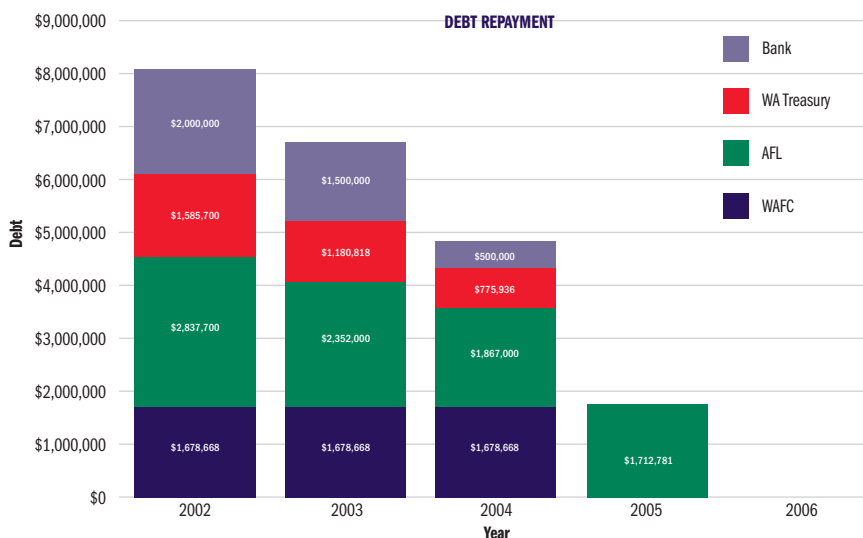
While revenues have continually grown over the period to \$23 million and with cost management remaining a key focus, the most critical component of this objective was achieved on 21 February 2005 when the club made its final AFL Licence payment to the AFL of \$1,712,780.82. The presentation of this payment to AFL Chief Executive Officer Andrew Demetriou also represented the removal of the club's remaining debt that stood at \$8.1 million at the end of 2002.

The club's aggressive debt reduction program could only have been successful with the delivery of substantial operating profits in each of the three years of the Strategic Plan. For the third successive year the club will post an operating profit and, following on from \$711,000 in 2003 and \$1.254 million in 2004, the 2005 profit result will be in excess of \$900,000 resulting in a total of almost \$3 million in operating profits being delivered from 2003 to 2005.

Debt free and profitable, the club's strict budget management processes will continue to focus on building revenues and managing costs to ensure sustained positive financial trading results in the future, essential for investment in the club's growth and development. The generation of operating profits will be critical as the club faces increased costs of operation in the future.

FOOTBALL

WE HAD set ourselves the clear target to participating in the finals in 2005. Missing out was bitterly disappointing for everyone involved at the club and for our supporters.



For the last two seasons, we have had to endure missing the finals in the last game of season. This disappointment will play its part in driving us to achieve, but the key will be our preparation, making the right decisions, and an absolute commitment to getting the best from ourselves at all levels.

The highlight was undoubtedly Matthew Pavlich who had an outstanding year, enjoying his permanent move to the forward line where he kicked 61 goals, polled 14 Brownlow votes, earned his third All Australian selection and second Doig Medal.

Captain Peter Bell was again terrific. Having missed all of pre-season after serious groin surgery, he played with great courage and leadership.

Heath Black made a welcome return to Fremantle, playing all 22 games, the club's leading possession winner and earning himself selection in the Australian side for the 2005 International Rules Series.

Injury free for the first time, Scott Thornton enjoyed a strong season to play all 22 games and Steven Dodd continued to show his development after being upgraded from the Rookie List for season 2005 and played sixteen games.



Whilst injuries played their part, especially in the middle of the season, it provided the opportunity for some of the club's young talent to experience the pressure of AFL level perhaps earlier than planned. Several players made their AFL debuts and made a positive contribution throughout the year – Brett Peake (9 games), Ryan Crowley (12 games), David Mundy (17 games), and Michael Johnson (11 games). David Mundy

received a AFL Rising Star nomination in round 14 and went on to finish third in the award at year's end.

While players enjoyed the first phase of their AFL careers, others celebrated significant career milestones. Shane Parker became the first Fremantle player to play 200 games for the club against Carlton in round 16. Shane has been a fantastic servant of the club and is a total professional in his training and preparation as he goes about completing his assigned task each week, often against bigger and stronger opponents. A player who has never attracted the recognition he deserves, Shane celebrated his milestone game by kicking his tenth goal in the AFL in part of a significant win for the club in 2005.

Peter Bell played his 100th game for the club in round 13 to become only the 22nd player in the history of the game to achieve 100 games with two clubs, Jarrad Schofield played his 200th AFL game in round 14, Troy Cook played his 150th AFL game in round 3, Des Headland played his 100th AFL game in round 8 and his 50th game for the club in round 11, joined by Aaron Sandilands, Byron Schammer, Luke McPharlin, and Graham Polak who also played their 50th game for Fremantle during the course of the year.

Peter Bell, Jeff Farmer and Luke McPharlin were selected in the WA State of Origin team in 2005. For Peter Bell it was his third consecutive selection. Shaun McManus and Troy Cook were admitted to the WAFL 200 Club.

Stability across the playing group has been a critical objective. The club has achieved exceptional results securing its players for the future including Matthew Pavlich, Luke McPharlin, Paul Hasleby, Justin Longmuir and interstate youngsters David Mundy, Ryan Murphy and Ryley Dunn.

The club did not participate in the 2006 Player Trade Week in preference to using its selections at the 2006 National Draft to add more exciting young talent to the squad. These selections gained Marcus Drum (from the Murray Bushrangers with selection 10), Garrick Ibbotson (from East Fremantle with selection 26) and Robert Warnock (from the Sandringham Dragons with selection 42).

The season was one of mixed fortunes and frustration, winning the unwinnable and losing games when we were expected to win. The year did provide some glimpses of the capacity and capability of the team. A tremendous shoot-out victory against Melbourne in round 6; a stirring backs-against-the-wall win against Geelong and the first at Skilled Stadium; a record score against Collingwood; a club record equalling five consecutive wins; and a memorable win after the siren against St Kilda.

Significant improvements have been made in on-field performance over the last three years with the club's winning ratio now standing at over fifty per cent over

the period and, significantly, the winning ratio in Melbourne is 58 per cent over the three years.

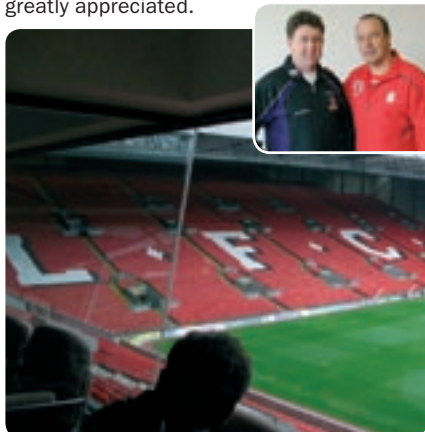
It is now time to take it to another level.

In October the club participated in its second exhibition game in London in three years and, with some senior players undergoing post season surgery, the game provided an opportunity for many of the younger players, such as rookies Jack Juniper, Joe Krieger, Paul Duffield and Michael Warren to wear Fremantle colours for the first time and for others to take the field after a frustrating season with injury such as Daniel Haines, Andrew Siegert and Luke Webster.



Many of the players in London took the opportunity of having a break overseas before returning to resume pre-season training on 7 November. From the London base, it also provided an opportunity to visit Premier League clubs Liverpool and Bolton Wanderers, thanks to our valued sponsor Reebok. These visits, similar to those conducted in 2003, allowed a rare behind the scenes and in-depth look at training, conditioning and athlete management systems. It has always been the commitment of the club that gaining knowledge of the methods and processes from a range of elite sports outside of Australian football is critical to the club's growth and development, particularly in an environment where each advantage gained, no matter how small, can make a difference.

The visit to 2005 European Cup Champions Liverpool provided a fantastic opportunity for Senior Coach Chris Connolly to not only watch training and inspect the outstanding facilities but also to spend considerable time meeting with manager Rafael Benitez. The hospitality of everyone at the Reds was greatly appreciated.



From London, a day visit to the \$100 million French Rugby Federation's Centre of Rugby Excellence, an advanced training facility located outside Paris, provided an in-depth view behind the scenes of France's high tech centre for rugby development. The investment made by the Federation, through such a massive facility, into the training, development and preparation of players in pursuit of improved on field performance was second to none.

It is the continued additional investment in the preparation and development of players that is required to maintain the development of the playing squad into this important stage of the club's growth. Significant investment has already been made by the Board for season 2006 in the club's fitness areas, with the appointment of an Assistant Strength and Conditioning Coach, an Injury Prevention and Rehabilitation Coach, and specialist resources for running, weights, and exercise physiology. In addition to this investment in people, further investments have been made in the gym equipment and sports science equipment that will provide Fremantle with one of the leading player training resource centres in the competition.

While the club moves into an exciting stage of our growth, it is time also to bid farewell to Assistant Coaches Chris Waterman and Simon Eastaugh who have accepted senior coaching positions with Peel and Perth in the WAFL respectively, and to Kevin Ball, biomechanist and skills coach who returns to Melbourne and will remain as a consultant to the club in 2006. All have made significant contributions to the development of the team and the individual players with whom they have worked closely with over their time at the club. The club sincerely thanks both Chris and Simon for their respective contributions since 2001.

The club welcomed three time Essendon premiership player Mark Harvey as Assistant Coach replacing Chris Waterman while Assistant Coach Steve Malaxos takes on a new role as Player Development Coach.

SPONSORSHIP

IN APRIL, Major Sponsor BankWest advised the club that it had chosen not to exercise their option to renew their sponsorship at the conclusion of the 2005 season. This decision, advised to the club early in 2005 was made in line with the requirements of the sponsorship agreement so as to provide adequate time for the club to secure and prepare the transition to a new major sponsor for 2006. BankWest have been associated with the club for a significant period of time and elevated its involvement from Gold Sponsor to Major Sponsor for the 2004 and 2005 seasons at a critical time in the club's rebuilding. The club thanks BankWest for its valued support of the Fremantle Football Club.

In November the club proudly announced that LG Electronics would become the

club's Major Sponsor for the next three years. There is no better way to build upon the club's recent achievements than with the support of one of Australia's and the world's, leading companies. The club is honoured and proud that LG Electronics has joined as Major Sponsor and will share in what will be an exciting time for the club.



Pleasingly, all major sponsorship properties were sold for the season. The club welcomed Reebok as the club's official apparel sponsor under the RBK mark, Mazda as the official motor vehicle sponsor and Spa Showcase as the coaches' sponsor.

The club extends its thanks and gratitude to all its sponsors for their loyal support, especially Platinum Sponsor Foster's Australia who have been loyal and valued supporters of the club and WA football.

SPONSORS, THE CLUB AND THE COMMUNITY

THE CLUB continues to commit heavily to its own wide-ranging community programmes and activities with the players visiting hospitals, schools and aged care groups, and attending charity and community fundraising activities. In addition the club joins together with our sponsors during the season to extend this support to selected charities in special match day activities and events.

In three special games each year, the club, its members and supporters join with club sponsors to raise much needed funds for key charities. Since 2003, these games have become highlights of the season and, thanks to the generosity of members and supporters, have raised over \$110,000 on game day over the last three years.

In round 7, the Alinta/Salvation Army Red Shield game raised almost \$10,000 to bring the total to nearly \$26,000 for the Salvation Army over the last three years to assist the Salvos tireless work in the community providing meals, clothing, shelter, crisis counselling and rehabilitation programs to so many in need throughout Western Australia.



The third annual Phillips Fox/Starlight Purple Haze Game was held on the round 9 game against Hawthorn. The game, launched in 2003, raises funds for the Starlight Children's Foundation and each year three players assume the role as Ambassadors for the Starlight Foundation and in the month leading up to the Purple Haze game, visit seriously ill children in hospitals around the metropolitan area. Des Headland, Jarrad Schofield and Graham Polak were this year's Ambassadors and launched the 2005 game at Fremantle Hospital as well as visiting Princess Margaret Hospital and St John of God Hospital Murdoch. The 2005 Phillips Fox/Starlight Purple Haze Game was the most successful to date raising more than \$29,000 at the game to take the three year total to over \$69,000. The funds are used to purchase Fun Centres for the Starlight rooms at various hospitals and for granting wishes to seriously ill children. This year's funds were used to purchase a Fun Centre for Rockingham Hospital.



Over the last two years, Patersons, the Australian Stockbroker and the club have joined together for the Patersons/Guide Dogs game to raise funds for the training of guide dogs in WA. Matthew Pavlich, Josh Carr and James Walker were the game's Ambassadors in 2005 and with nearly \$10,000 raised at the game in round 15, the total has now passed \$17,000.



MARKETING Membership

The amazing growth in club membership continued in season 2005 and a new record was set at 34,124 members at the AFL reporting date of 15 June 2005. In season 2001, the club's membership stood at 23,818 and just four years later, this number has increased by a staggering 10,226 members, an increase of nearly 43 per cent.

In 2003, the club challenged Fremantle supporters through its 'Do You Have The Passion?' membership campaign and they have well and truly responded and membership is now the sixth largest in the AFL. It is well known that Fremantle members and supporters are loyal and passionate people, proud of their club. They can be rightfully proud in 2005.

Home game attendances again averaged in excess of 35,000 per game following on from last season's record attendances. In season 2004, total attendances at Fremantle games, both home and away, totalled 689,600 to set a new club record. In 2005 total attendances reached 689,015.

Support for our club continues to be very strong and, with continued growth in membership and support both in Western Australia and interstate, the outlook for the future remains strong.

A special thank you to both the WA Cheer Squad, led this year by Dawn Wells, and WA Banner Team, led by Maria Giglia, who once again were fantastic in their efforts in 2005. Each and every week they generously volunteer their time organising their activities for game day and it is certainly appreciated.

The club was not only delighted with the number of new members joining but the very high retention rate of members from season 2004, highlighting the loyalty and passion of Fremantle members.

The club continued to introduce new member initiatives including an exclusive Member Rewards program through the club's internet site and the *Docker* magazine, exclusive merchandise vouchers that were redeemed in record numbers in 2005, three member luncheons held in the Doig Room at Subiaco Oval on game day and sensational travel packages for away games through the club's travel partner, Motive Travel.

A special thank you our A.J. Diamond and Derby Club Coterie Groups who once again gave the club fantastic support throughout the year and their fund raising activities allowed the club to install a boxing ring in the club's gymnasium which the "Green Machine", boxing champion Danny Green officially opened and for the Derby Club to donate new lounges for the Player's Lounge at the club.

Corporate Hospitality

The club enjoyed another great year of fantastic corporate support with over 450 corporate partners participating in club events and game day, the highest number in the club's history. Over the course of the year, over 33,000 corporate members and guests took the opportunity to experience game day hospitality in corporate facilities including Corporate Suites, Dining Rooms and VIP Private Boxes around Subiaco Oval during 2005.



The exclusive game day Corporate Dining packages reached capacity levels for the first time and enjoyed many special guest speakers including Doug Hawkins, Justin Langer, and David Parkin.

The hugely popular Coaches Corner, introduced in season 2004, was sold out in season 2005. Coaches Corner is a truly unique experience for corporate guests to enjoy premium hospitality pre-game and a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to visit the change rooms prior to the game to meet

with the coaches and go through strategy and key match-ups for the game.

A new initiative for 2005 was the Corporate Training Session held on Subiaco Oval prior to the Round 3 Carlton Mid Derby with Corporate Club members put through their paces at the home of WA football before the twenty-first derby.

Merchandise

It was a very successful year for the club's Merchandise division as not only did the club welcome Reebok as the club's

official apparel sponsor with the RBK logo appearing on all club apparel in 2005 but the club achieved a record level of sales, surpassing \$1 million in merchandise sales for the year.

A special thanks to all our members and supporters who continued to support the Team Store at Fremantle Oval and utilised the club's internet site to deliver record sales through the club's on-line store which for the first time provided full catalogue availability.

A number of initiatives during the year contributed to the great success in merchandise with exclusive merchandise offers.

Events

Over 10,000 people attended club events during the course of the year including the 2005 Season Launch, Sponsor and Corporate functions on Tuesday evening team training sessions, new members functions, the 2005 Carlton Mid Banquet Auction that delivered a record result for the Community Development Programme, the 2005 Doig Medal Presentation Dinner, the Brownes Chill Junior Member Christmas Party, the Family Fun Day, Corporate Golf Day as well as numerous other club events. With the increased popularity of club events in 2005 and the tremendous support given by sponsors, corporate partners and members alike, the 2006 Events Calendar will again present a full variety of events throughout the year.

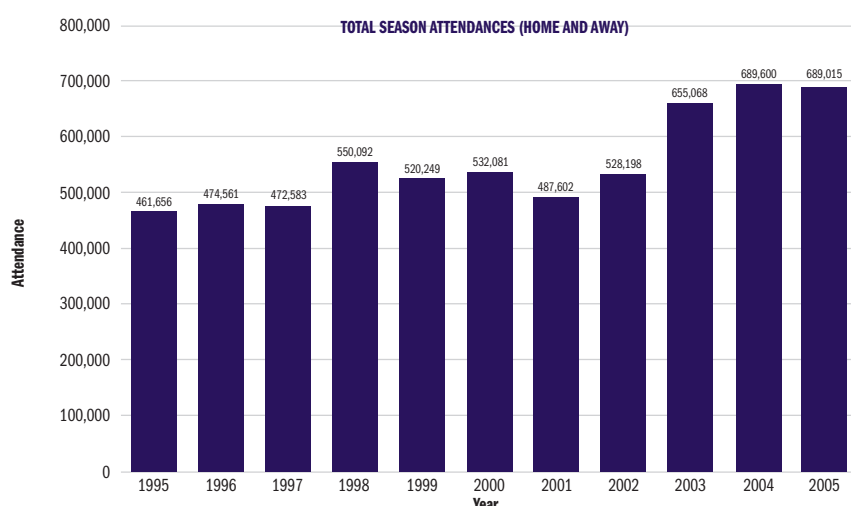
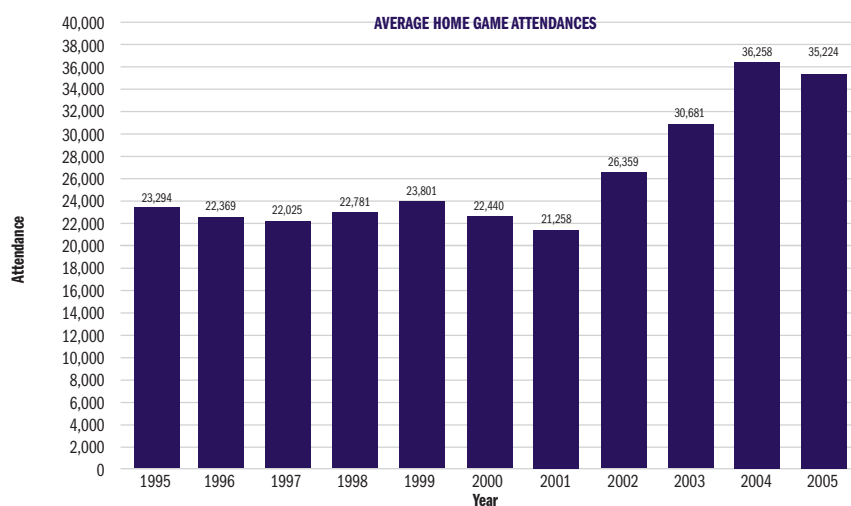
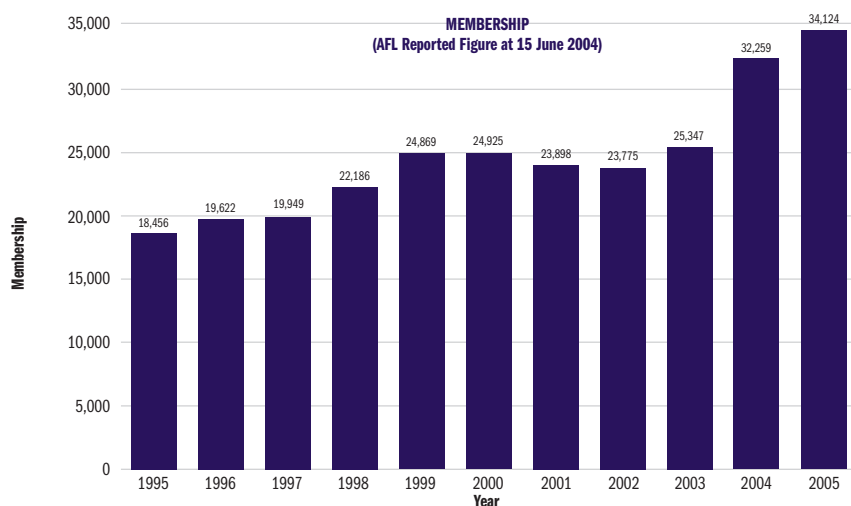


Interstate

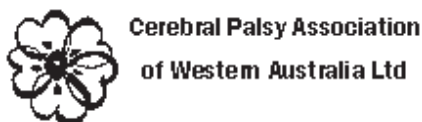

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME



THE CLUB'S Community Development Programme, launched in 2004 has now expanded even further in 2005 to be the most far reaching and inclusive community programme within the AFL. Comprising over 50 key programme initiatives, the core activities of the programme include the AFL Community Camp, Johnny 'The Doc' Docker Motor Skills Programme, AFL Experience clinics, the Freo Long Bomb and Team Banner Competitions, the Tuesday School of The Week programme, and the U16 and U17 Fremantle Football Club Youth Leagues. While these core activities will continue to be expanded in 2006, many new initiatives will also be introduced. The commitment of the Fremantle players to the Community Development Programme in 2005 was again outstanding as thousands of children were able to benefit from the educational and enjoyable initiatives each week.

2005 Community Camp



The AFL Community Camps are an important and valuable way in which AFL clubs are able to visit regional centres to provide a unique experience for local residents that they would rarely have the opportunity of experiencing

After visiting Bunbury in 2003 and Geraldton in 2004, the club ventured to the heart of the Pilbara in 2005 in what shaped as the largest ever regional visit ever undertaken by any AFL Club. Such was the scale of the undertaking and its importance for the AFL that the AFL's General Manager Football Operations Adrian Anderson chose to attend the camp to witness first hand the tremendous reception for the club in the remote north west.

The players were divided into groups with sixteen players based in Karratha while over the first two days of camp ten players visited Port Hedland and five each ventured to Newman and Tom Price before rejoining the main group for the last day of the camp.

Players visited primary and high schools, held junior clinics in each town, visited local businesses, attended community barbeques and on the last day conducted a massive junior clinic at Dampier Oval attended by more than 1000 children who stayed after the clinic to watch a team training session that saw the crowd build to more than 3,000.

2005 Schools Programme

The Schools Programme is an integrated suite of initiatives of the Community Development Programme including the AFL Experience Clinics, a Team Banner competition, Freo Long Bomb, the School of The Week and the Johnny 'The Doc' Docker Motor Skills Programme. The Schools Programme continues to be boosted with new initiatives and 2006 will see the Freo Kwik Kick join the programme.

Johnny 'The Doc' Motor Skills Programme



In conjunction with Notre Dame University, the club developed and conducted the Johnny "The Doc" Docker Motor Skills Programme in selected pre-primary centres throughout Perth for the first time in 2005. The Motor Skills Programme is designed to introduce simple play activities that promote basic motor, communication and social skills with an emphasis on enjoyment.

The programme involves Fremantle players delivering basic motor skill lessons to pre-primary students where they take children through basic warm-up exercises, balance and agility sessions and general hand-eye skills sessions that focus on fun, developing body awareness and motor skills.

The activities are half an hour in duration and in season 2005, players visited an average of three schools per fortnight in the second and third terms of the school

year. Parents and teachers are provided with a resource package that allows them to continue practising the key messages and philosophies that are introduced in the initial session with the players.

This year, participating schools have included Graylands PS, Subiaco PS, West Leederville PS, Weld Square PS, Yokine PS, Majella Catholic Primary, Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Phoenix PS, Spearwood Alternative PS, City Beach PS, Holy Spirit PS, St Thomas PS, Guilford Grammar prep school, Guilford PS, Woodbridge PS, Lake Gwelup PS, West Balcatta Primary, Thornlie PS, Huntingdale PS, Richmond PS, Palmyra PS, Booragoon PS, Ocean Reef PS, Connolly PS and Lake Joondalup PS. The club would like to thank each school and every parent for their support.

The School of the Week



This programme initiative has once again been a huge success in 2005 as primary school children are given the opportunity to attend the club's popular training session on Tuesdays at Fremantle Oval where they participate in a skills clinic, visit the players lecture theatre and view a highlights video, watching team training from their own special cordoned off area and have the opportunity to meet players and get an autograph or photo.

The School of the Week initiative in 2005 has again reached more than 2,000 children with visits from South Perth PS, South Fremantle PS, Orelia PS, Newton PS, Maddington PS, Applecross Junior Football Club, Fremantle PS, Mt Barker PS, Maddington PS, Aquinas Junior, Adam Road PS, St Patricks PS, Greenfields PS, Our Lady of Mount Carmel PS, Cowaramup PS, Little Grove PS, Booragoon PS, Mt Magnet PS, High Wycombe JFC, Secret Harbour JFC, Ellenbrook JFC, Yarloop PS, Binu PS, All Saints PS, Cue PS, Claremont FC, Wanslea Group, Jandakot PS, Kensington School, Nannup PS, Canningvale PS, Dunsborough PS, St Johns School and Scarborough Junior Football Club.



Youth Leagues



The flagship initiative of the Community Development Programme, the U16 and U17 Fremantle Football Club Youth Leagues were expanded further throughout Western Australia during season 2005. With the U17 Youth League encompassing all U17's leagues in the Perth Metropolitan area, the focus for the U16 Youth League is regional WA with the competition launched in 2004 in the Peel and South West regions and expanded in 2005 across the Southern Districts Junior Football and Esperance. The Mid West will join the U16 Youth League in 2006.

With Fremantle providing resources, support and expertise to all junior competitions involved in both the U17 and U16 levels, the Youth Leagues are aimed at improving the retention level of young footballers in the game with a key feature of the youth leagues this year has been the scheduling of selected games as curtain raisers prior to each of the Fremantle home games.

Teams including Huntingdale, Kenwick, Noranda, Bibra Lake, West Coast, Roleystone, Booragoon/Applecross, Rostrata and teams from Albany, Esperance, Bunbury & Busselton all enjoyed the opportunity to play on Subiaco Oval. The teams from Albany and Esperance also enjoyed tours of the Fremantle headquarters, a training session on Fremantle Oval, use of the club facilities and a BBQ.

Freo Long Bomb



More than 8,000 participants from 77 schools across Western Australia participated in the Long Bomb competition in 2005 competing in four different categories including, years 4/5 girls and boys and years 6/7 girls and boys.



Designed specifically for primary school students, the Long Bomb competition is a fun event encouraging school spirit through participation and enjoyable competition, while assisting the skill development of junior footballers. The long bomb competition winners in each age group attended Fremantle Oval where over 300 children who took part in the 2005 Long Bomb Finals series and between them,

the top four students from each of the 77 schools kicked the football a total of 7.62 kilometres.

Every student who participated in the Fremantle Long Bomb competition in 2005 received a Participation Certificate and every participating school received a donation of five footballs.

In 2006 a new programme, Freo Kwik Kick will become the sister programme to Freo Long Bomb, and is an exciting kick-to-kick competition testing how many kicks can be achieved in a set time period.



Team Banner Competition



Students from all over Western Australia had the opportunity to enter into the 2005 Fremantle Football Club Team Banner Competition earlier this year, with more than 100 entries being received to design a team banner to inspire the team as they ran onto Subiaco Oval for the game against the Western Bulldogs in Round 15.



When designing their team banner, students were asked to consider local Fremantle landmarks or icons, the history of the club, recent events and that theme for the game, the 2005 Patersons Guide Dogs Game.

With the support of the Lakewood Logistics Group, the 'Rick Hart Challenge' is open to all players of clubs participating in either of the leagues and clubs were open to nominate a single player to participate in a series of 100 metre sprints held at Fremantle Oval during the year. The fastest 20 sprinters were then invited to Subiaco Oval to take part in the semi-finals, held before the round 17 and 19 games.

The final of the 2005 Rick Hart Challenge took place prior to the start of the round 21 game against St Kilda game on Friday 19 August and the fastest young footballer for 2005 was Ben Gillett from Sorrento Duncraig Junior Football Club, running the 100 metre sprint in just 11.46 seconds.

Junior Club Visits

A key part of the club's commitment to grass roots football is the role our players play with junior footballers. 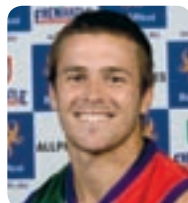

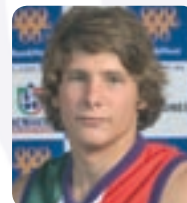

His opportunity to play at the elite level came with the formation of the Fremantle Football Club and from humble beginnings he has forged an impressive career spanning eleven seasons and 206 games to be Fremantle's games record holder. It's no coincidence that Fremantle's first win in the AFL coincided with Parker's debut in round 3, 1995 against Fitzroy at the Western Oval. A model of consistency in the heart of Fremantle's defence he is a well liked and respected senior member of the playing group.

GARRY DHURRKAY

Originally from Colac in Victoria he played a total of 36 games for Fremantle.
